The Accelerated Cross Categorical Special Education program focuses on developing individuals into strong, compassionate, and highly-skilled K-12 special education teachers. Earn your bachelor's degree and Wisconsin teaching license in three years with online courses delivered in 8-week sessions. In-person field experiences are required to establish your classroom skills and interactions with varying age levels and disabilities.

Your studies in special education include a solid liberal arts foundation, a Christian emphasis, and specialized coursework that gives you the confidence and experience to teach, lead, and mentor K-12 students with a wide variety of special needs.

NEXT STEPS

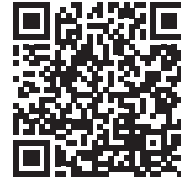
1. Submit your application
