*WHEREAS*; Wisconsin passed the nation's first regulated apprenticeship law in 1911; and

*WHEREAS*; apprenticeship training provides Wisconsin with highly skilled craft workers; and

*WHEREAS*; the Bureau of Apprenticeship Standards in the Department of Workforce Development's Division of Employment and Training works in collaboration with many partners to support and expand apprenticeship programs in the state of Wisconsin; and

*WHEREAS*, the success of Wisconsin apprenticeships is made possible through partnerships with the Wisconsin Technical College System, the Wisconsin Apprenticeship Advisory Council, the U.S. Department of Labor's Office of Apprenticeship, and many representatives from labor, management, and business entities, and these groups work together to promote and expand apprenticeship programs in the state of Wisconsin; and

*WHEREAS*; the Wisconsin apprenticeship community is committed to continued innovation, leadership, and a strong talent pipeline of skilled workers for generations to come; and

*WHEREAS*; it is appropriate for Wisconsin to recognize apprentices and those who are actively seeking an apprenticeship and the in-demand skills, self-sufficiency, and family-supporting jobs that accompany journey-worker status;


*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Scott Walker, Governor of the state of Wisconsin,
